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# **School Closure / Remote Learning**

You will have heard via the media in recent weeks that schools will remain closed to pupils until at least Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2021, with reopening possible on the Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2021 (Depending on the Covid-19 situation at that time). I will continue to keep you up to date with the latest information as soon as possible.

Supervised learning continues at school during this period to vulnerable children and those of key workers.

### **Remote Learning Packs**

## **Microsoft Teams Assignments**

From Monday 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021, all year groups in school will be asked to complete one of their remote learning activities as an assignment each day, something which primary six and seven have been doing for a number of weeks now. This does not change any of the work set for your child, or how it is to be completed. Rather, it requests that a photograph of your child's work is uploaded onto Microsoft Teams in order for your child's teacher to be able to provide more timely and relevant feedback.

#### **Primary Seven / Post Primary Applications**

If your child is in primary seven, they will be due to start post-primary school in September 2021.

The online application portal will be open at 12 noon on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2021 and remain open until 4pm on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2021. Please note that this is not a first come first served basis and post-primary schools will only begin to make decisions on applications after the closing date for applications has passed.

We will share with you an electronic copy of the key information leaflet 'Applying for a post-primary school place' in the coming weeks. This leaflet and further guidance will be accessible on the Education Authority's website to assist you in making an online application.

#### **Pupil / Parent Questionnaire**

A short online questionnaire, for both pupils and parents, will be released on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2021. Could I request that all pupils and parents (if possible) complete this short survey, in order for a greater number of thoughts and opinions to be collated. The aim of the questionnaire is to gather information on pupil and parent experiences during school closure, to evaluate the level of school support and to help the school plan for any additional or different support and approaches which may be needed in the coming weeks.
